


	<p>Gyamu Atiko</p> <p>Symbol of bravery, fearlessness and valor</p>
	<p>Aban</p> <p>Symbol of strength, power, authority and magnificence</p>
	<p>Odo Nyera Fie Kwan</p> <p>Symbol of love, devotion and faithfulness.</p>
	<p>Dweni Ni Mmen</p> <p>Symbol of strength, humility, wisdom and learning</p>
	<p>Nyame Nwu Na Mawu</p> <p>Symbol for the Omni-presence of God, and the infinity of man's soul.</p>

	<p>Asase Ye Duru</p> <p>Symbol of providence and the divinity of Mother Earth</p>
	<p>Dono Ntoaso</p> <p>Symbol of united action, goodwill, praise, mirth, rejoicing</p>
	<p>Eban</p> <p>Symbol of safety, security and love</p>
	<p>Epa</p> <p>Symbol of law and justice</p>
	<p>Fi-hankare</p> <p>Symbol of brotherhood, safety, completeness, solidarity</p>
	<p>Hye-wo-nyhe</p> <p>Symbol of toughness and imperishability of self; a symbol of permanency</p>

	<p>Nserewa</p> <p>Symbol of affluence and wealth</p>
	<p>Ohene Aniwa</p> <p>Symbol of beauty, vigilance, protection, security and excellence</p>
	<p>Osram Ne Nsoroma</p> <p>Symbol of faithfulness, fondness, harmony, benevolence, love, loyalty and femininity</p>
	<p>Pempamsie</p> <p>Symbol of the need for ever-readiness, steadfastness, hardiness, valor and fearlessness</p>
	<p>Sepo</p> <p>Symbol of the law; justice</p>
	<p>Tabono</p> <p>Symbol of strength, confidence and persistence</p>
